

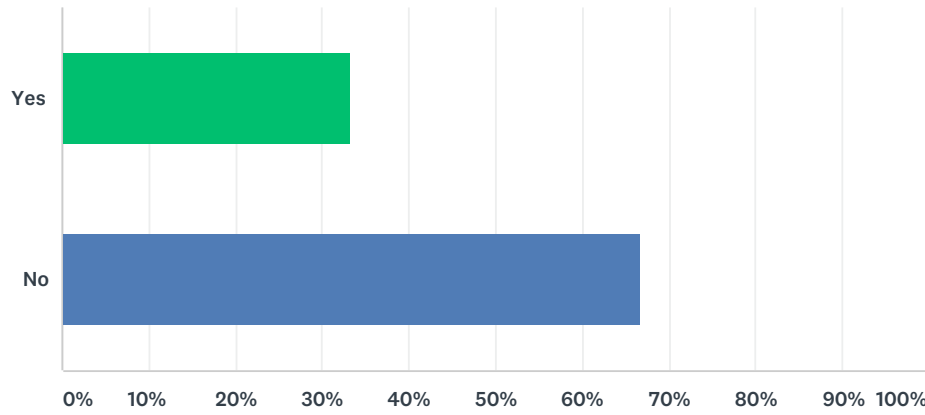

It shall be unlawful for any person owning or harboring a restricted dog or cat to permit such a dog or cat to be outside of any enclosure at any time except when that dog or cat is restrained by a leash. ('80 Code, § 90.05) (Ord. 20-78, passed 10-30-78) Penalty, see § 91.99 § 91.07 RESTRAINT OF UNRESTRICTED DOG. It shall be unlawful for an owner or harbinger of more than two dogs to allow any of the dogs in his or her custody to be unrestrained by a leash when on any public or private property other than the property of the owner or harbinger in charge of the dogs. This restriction shall not apply to special events approved by the City Manager. Two or fewer dogs may be unrestrained by an owner or harbinger, subject to all other provisions of this section. (Ord. 07-17, passed 8-28-17) § 91.99 PENALTY. (A) Any owner or harbinger found in violation of § 91.01, § 91.05 or § 91.07 shall be guilty of a minor misdemeanor.
