The Office of the City Manager for the City of Mason, Ohio respectfully submits the following application to Mason City Council to approve and enact a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area in Downtown Mason in accordance with O.R.C. 4301.82

I. Introduction and Submittal of Application

Effective April 30, 2017 Section 4301.82 of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes municipalities under 35,000 in population to create Designated Outdoor Refreshment Areas or "DORAs." In order to consider the creation of a DORA, the City Manager must file an application with City Council which meets certain statutory requirements outlined below. The application filing must be advertised for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation. Not earlier than 30 days, but not later than 60 days, after initial publication of the notice, City Council may approve or disapprove of the application by ordinance or resolution.

The creation of a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area will serve as an economic tool to attract patrons to Downtown Mason and highlight the area as a destination for dining and entertainment. Over the past 12 months, the Downtown Committee of Council and the Arts and Entertainment Committee of Council provided input and expressed general support for the concept and indicated by discussion to pursue the application process for consideration by Council.

The purpose of this application is to request that City Council create and approve a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) in the City of Mason. The application includes the following sections:

- A map of the proposed Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (150 acres or less)
- A statement of the nature and type of establishments in the proposed area
- A statement verifying that not less than four liquor permit holders are included in the area
- Evidence that the land use in the Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area is in accord with the City of Mason's Master Plan
- Proposed requirements that ensure the public health and safety in the Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area
- Dates and hours of operations

Section 1. Map of Proposed DORA, not exceeding 150 contiguous acres

Please refer to **Exhibit A** attached. Exhibit A includes a map of the proposed Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area as well as the list of establishments that have the necessary D liquor permits within the area. 11 establishments have been identified that qualify to be included in the Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area. The proposed Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area is 47.5 acres in size which is well below the requirements of the area being 150 acres or less.

Section 2. Nature and Types of Establishments located within the DORA

Please refer to **Exhibit B** attached. Exhibit B outlines the establishments and types located within the Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area. The proposed DORA consists primarily of businesses in the form of boutiques, retail, restaurants and financial and insurance establishments.

Section 3. List of Qualified Permit Holders

Please refer to **Exhibit C** attached. Exhibit C outlines the establishments within the Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area that currently have a D liquor permit which is the necessary permit required to participate in a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area. In accordance with O.R.C. 4301.82(B)(3) the DORA will encompass not fewer than four qualified permit holders. The City of Mason has identified 11 qualified permit holders that are included in the DORA.

Section 4. Evidence that Use of Land within DORA are in accord with Mason's Comprehensive Plan

The City of Mason updated its Comprehensive Plan in 2010. The Comprehensive Plan states that one of the top public priorities is to revitalize Downtown Mason as a destination with a vibrant restaurant, arts, retail and lodging scene. A majority of the property located in Mason's Downtown is zoned for mixed use development and is called out in the Comprehensive Plan as community core-mixed use as outlined in **Exhibit D**. This designation's objective is to maintain, enhance, and grow the Community Core as a vibrant, mixed use gathering place and cultural center with an emphasis on retail, arts and entertainment uses. The Community Core maintains a highly urban, pedestrian focused environment through building and streetscape.

The creation of a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area in downtown Mason aligns with the City's Comprehensive Plan and objective to make this area a popular destination for dining and entertainment within the City.

Section 5. Proposed Requirements for Ensuring Public Health and Safety within the DORA

City of Mason Public Works Department will be responsible for maintaining the appearance and public health within the DORA. Please see attached Sanitation Plan in **Exhibit E**. Exhibit E shows that there are currently 22 permanent trash receptacles placed along US Route 42 that are serviced once per week (shown in red). The City is proposing the installation of 15 new trash receptacles within the Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area to fill gaps in coverage (shown in green). The trash receptacles will be serviced by the City's waste and recycling contractor once per week. Additional collections will be done on an as needed basis. The City's Public Works Department will monitor the receptacles and coordinate additional collections if needed.

For planned events in the DORA that may draw larger than normal attendance, portable restroom facilities will be provided at a central location within the DORA. Businesses with liquor permits within the DORA that are participating will be encouraged to allow general public access to their restroom facilities during the hours DORA is in effect.

Please see attached Boundary Signage Plan and design in **Exhibit G.** The City is proposing 17 areas where installation of boundary signage will be necessary to preserve public safety.

Section 6. Designated Hours of Operation

The Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area will be in operation from 6 p.m. to midnight Monday through Thursday and noon to midnight Friday through Sunday. Extended times for special events may be established by the Chief of Police and City Manager with the concurrence by a vote of City Council. Such concurrence would be made by motion.





Map 8.2A: Community Core Sub-Area Plan



In accordance with ORC 4301.82(B)(5), the proposed requirements for the purpose of ensuring public safety within the Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) are as follows:

Law Enforcement Responsibilities

The Police Department will be responsible for providing law enforcement services within the DORA. The city is divided into 4 patrol districts with at least one officer assigned to each district. The DORA is split between Districts 1 and 2 and the officers assigned to those districts will have primary responsibility for providing services within the DORA.


The on-duty supervisor shall ensure that appropriate attention is provided to the DORA during the hours of operation. In the event a larger than normal number of people are in the DORA, the on-duty supervisor may assign additional officers and/or assign an officer to specifically patrol the DORA. The use of the Segway, foot patrol, bicycle patrol as well as campus security specialists will be considered as alternate methods of patrolling in the DORA.

For planned events in the DORA that may draw larger than normal attendance, the Chief of Police may have additional officers and/or other agency personnel assigned specifically to the DORA.

Fire/EMS Responsibilities

The Fire Department will be responsible for providing Fire, Rescue, and EMS within the DORA. Station 51 is located approximately one (1) mile from the closest boundary of the DORA and is 1.4 miles to the furthest boundary. Estimated response time would be between three and four minutes to any area within the DORA.

For planned events in the DORA that may draw larger than normal attendance, the Fire Chief may stage personnel and/or equipment in a location within or near the DORA to allow for an immediate response.




