DURATION: March - August

YOU WILL LEARN: Local government 101, effective communications, leadership strengths, finance and budgeting, HR best practices, and economic development.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE: Staff from Center for Local Government or Miami Valley Risk Management Association member jurisdictions. (1 per community during the first round of applications).

What is the purpose of the Leadership Academy:

- 1. Provide an affordable leadership and management skill development opportunity for local government employees.
- 2. Build relationships between employees of neighboring communities—leading to future collaboration.

Classes are taught by local government practitioners and subject matter specialists. Classes are designed to focus on practical applicable skills, such as effective communications, leadership styles, human resources and finance.

What does participation entail?

The Leadership Academy consists of 1 class per month from March to August. Classes are held at local government facilities around the region. Classes last from 9am until either 3pm or 4pm.

Each class focuses on an aspect of local government management. Some classes will include "showcases," which will feature additional local professional development opportunities. Learn more about each class on the upcoming pages.





WHO SHOULD PARTICIPATE IN THE CLG LEADERSHIP ACADEMY?

The Leadership Academy is designed for any employee of a CLG or MVRMA member community who wants to improve their leadership or management skills. This encompasses a WIDE VARIETY of positions. For example, prior Academies have included a City Engineer, a Fire Chief, an Information Systems Coordinator, an Administrative Assistant, a Special Events Coordinator, an Assistant City Manager, a Finance Director, and many other positions at all levels.

WHY SHOULD I PARTICIPATE?

- You will learn leadership and management techniques from a mix of practicing local government professionals, instructors from local universities, and other subject matter experts.
- You will have a choice of one of two courses taught by Xavier University, alongside other local government and business professionals.
- You will have an opportunity to meet and build relationships with people on a similar career track from neighboring jurisdictions.
- Over 200 Leadership Academy graduates can be found today sharing information or working together on projects on behalf of their communi-

ties. Leadership Academy alumni also teach our Human Resources, Budgeting & Finance, and Economic Development & Land Use classes.

What Classes will I take?

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LOCAL GOVERNMENT 101

This class provides an introduction to the Leadership Academy and an overview on local governments and their various structures and roles. There will be group exercises putting you in the role of the Administrator, elected official, or other government officials. This class will also cover topics such as ethics, open records, and other issues of legal importance. Finally, you will have a chance to meet your fellow participants and hear from previous participants about how best take advantage of the Leadership Academy. This class is instructed by Ohio Plan Executive Director Michael Hinnenkamp.

Participants are encouraged to think about real-life organizational problems and bring these situations to the program to discuss and brainstorm together. By walking through these problems together, participants will learn the steps to creatively solve problems.

What is my commitment?

We have designed the Center for Local Government Leadership Academy to be compatible with your work commitments. As such, we only have one class per month, and there is no overnight retreat or any group project. However, in order to make sure you get the most out of the Leadership Academy experience, we ask that you are able to commit to the following:



ATTENDANCE

- Leadership Academy classes run from March until August. We have attempted to always schedule these on Wednesdays form 9:00am until 3:00pm, **but there are some exceptions.**
- We expect attendance at all classes, but we understand if a work emergency or other extraordinary circumstance causes you to miss a class. If you miss a class, you are expected to find an alternative training to attend on a similar topic. This alternative training would be subject for approval by CLG. Please seek out T.J. White (TWhite@C4LG.org) if you have to miss a class.
- If you miss more than two classes, you may be asked to withdraw from the program.

REFLECTION AND EVALUATION

- Each Leadership Academy participant will be provided with a binder to hold any class materials or handouts. Each binder will also have a reflection form. This form will ask you to identify what your takeaway from each class was, how you would apply the lessons of that class to your job on a day-to-day basis, and how you would apply the lessons of that class to your career. These are for you to keep. Do not turn them in.
- You are expected to come with one topic to share with your peers. Every class has moments
 for networking. It is important that you use this opportunity to use the collective knowledge
 of the group.
- Finally, you are also expected to fill out all class evaluations. These will be distributed online after every class.



How do I apply to the Leadership Academy?

 Please note that the <u>deadline for the first round of applications</u> is 5pm on Friday March 1, 2024
 - If all 20 Leadership Academy seats are not filled after the first round, we will open a second round.
- There is only space in the Leadership Academy for 20 people. Also keep in mind that the Xavier University course offerings will be filled on a first come first served basis. *In order to ensure that we are fair to all potential participants, we will only accept one applicant per government.*
- If your community has more than one applicant:
 - If there are remaining slots after the application period has closed, all governments with multiple applicants will be placed in a lottery to determine who can send an additional applicant this year.
 - If your community is NOT selected for an additional applicant, the Chief Administrative Officer will select an attendee for this year and will select one to defer to a future year.
 - Depending on availability, there may be an opportunity for a second applicant from one community to enter the Academy after the initial 20 slots have been filled. However, to do this, that applicant will have a higher tuition amount. Governments with multiple applicants will be notified of this opportunity if it becomes available.
- Finally, the cost for the Leadership Academy is \$930 per person. CLG always applies for grants for the Academy on an annual basis. This may reduce the tuition cost.
